LETTER FROM OUR LEADERSHIP

Dear Friends,

The past few years have demonstrated that the need for HAVEN's services is greater than ever. HAVEN staff, board, and volunteers are deeply committed to ending violence and empowering all of those adversely affected: women, men, non-binary and transgender adults, youth, and families in Rockingham and Strafford counties to heal from abuse and rebuild their lives.

There is a mental health crisis among our youth. HAVEN's K – 12 Prevention Education programs are critical to reaching youth at risk. Our educators teach children important safety rules and to identify a trusted grown-up if they are hurt, confused, or scared so they can begin to heal.

HAVEN has partnered with Camp HOPE America! This important program utilizes an innovative approach of combining the power of a summer camp experience with year-round mentoring and educational activities, creating pathways to hope for children who have experienced trauma. This is the first such collaboration in NH and expands our efforts to break the cycle of violence and provide a vision of hope and healing.

There is a critical need to expand HAVEN's shelter capacity and housing programs. HAVEN has achieved a small success in leasing a 6-unit apartment building, allowing us to increase our capacity from 4 to 11 bedrooms and provide office space for our shelter staff to be on-site, providing programming.

HAVEN is proud of our partnerships with landlords in our community to help provide victims of domestic violence access to housing. **We are excited about our HAVEN at the Falls collaboration with Dover Housing Authority.** This collaboration provides affordable housing units dedicated to survivors of domestic violence and creates a path to self-sufficiency and safe and permanent homes.

We continue to provide mobile advocacy which removes barriers to accessing services and has our Client Services staff traveling to meet with survivors throughout our region.

HAVEN recognizes the success of our mission lies with our workforce. **The people - staff as well as volunteers - fuel our mission.** Our goal at HAVEN is to continue to expand our services and programs, while simultaneously investing in our most valuable resource – our staff.

While much has been accomplished there is still so much more work to do! We hope you are as motivated and inspired as we are to join us in ending violence and changing lives by attending an event, volunteering, or making a donation in the coming year. **Together with the community, HAVEN will realize our vision of eliminating domestic and sexual violence through education, support, and social change.**

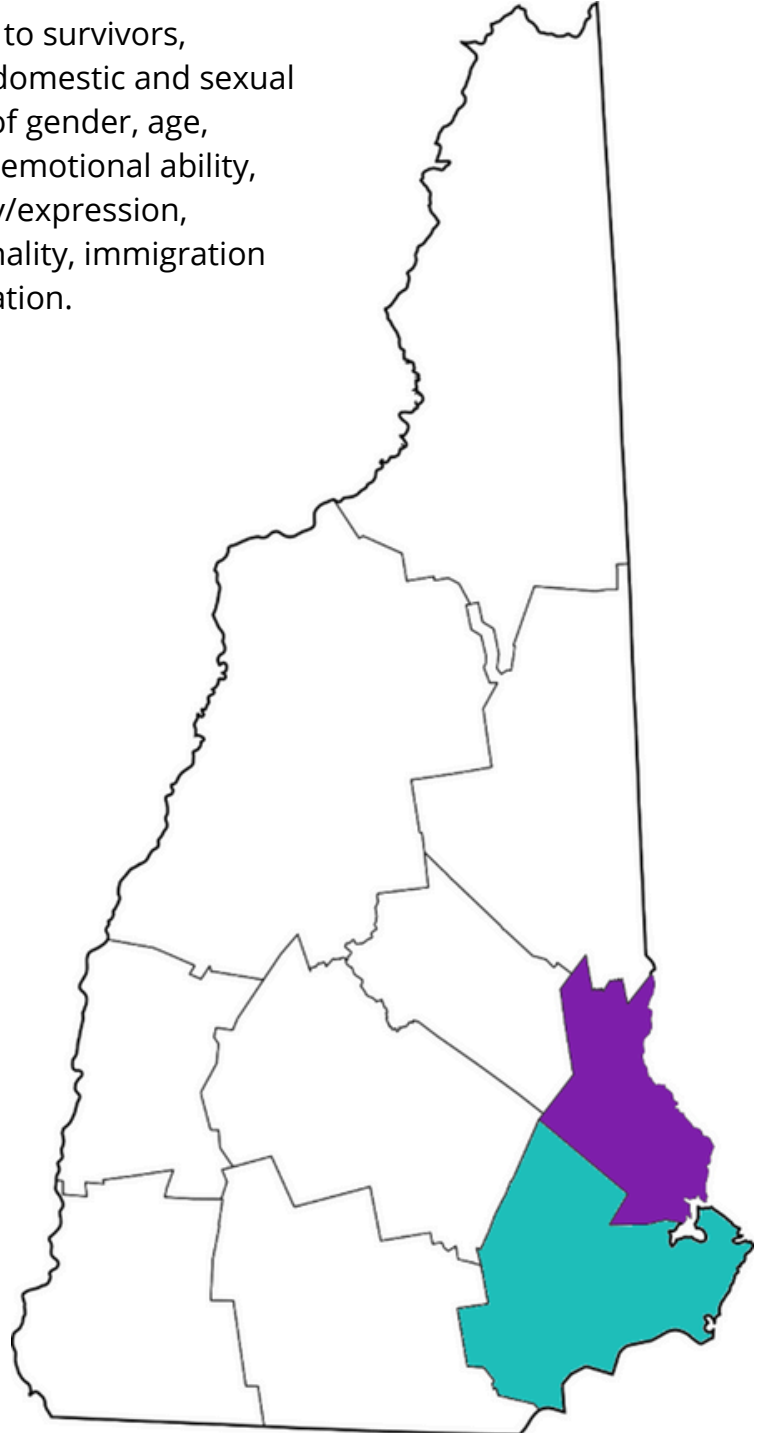
SERVICE AREA

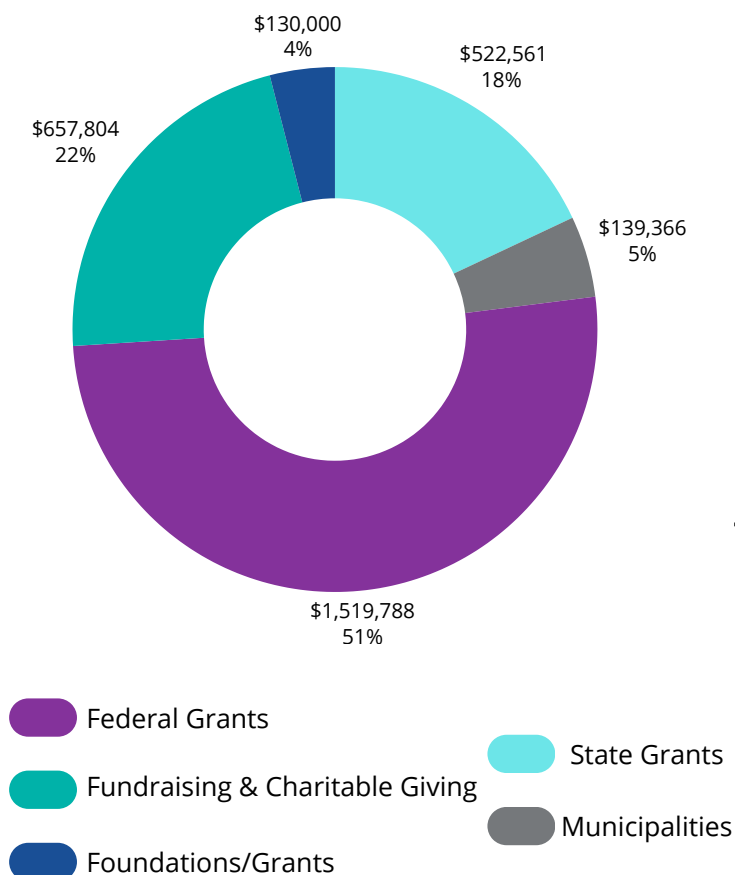

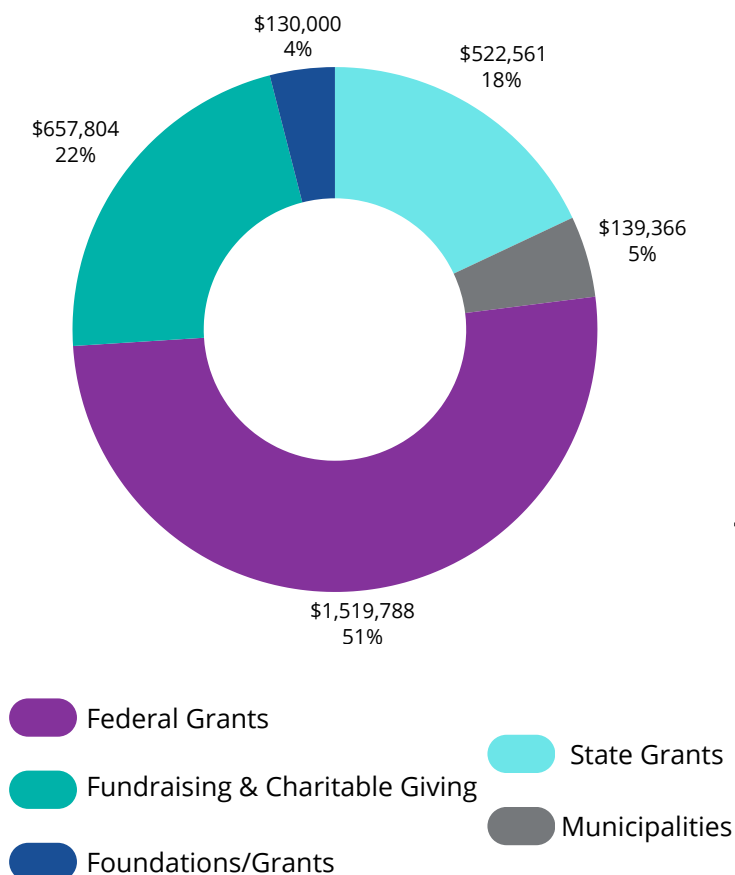

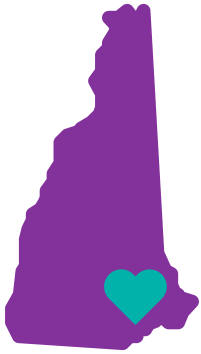

SUCCESS STORY

A client with two small children, in need of finding safe, permanent housing as soon as possible, was enrolled through the Office on Violence Against Women Federal Housing Grant. Since her time in the program, she has gone on to graduate from school and gain her nursing qualifications. Her incredible hard work and HAVEN's supportive services, have provided her with the opportunity to be happy, thriving, and finally feel safe. She says she *'looks forward to a happy future free from violence'*.



VOLUNTEERS

HAVEN has **49 ongoing volunteers** who have donated approximately **9,704 hours** of their time.

We also welcomed **21 volunteers** from local businesses who spent upward of 12 hours at 2 all day volunteer events.



OUTREACH

HAVEN staffed info **tables at 34 different events** over FY 22-23. This time was spent connecting with the community **totaled nearly 145 hours**.

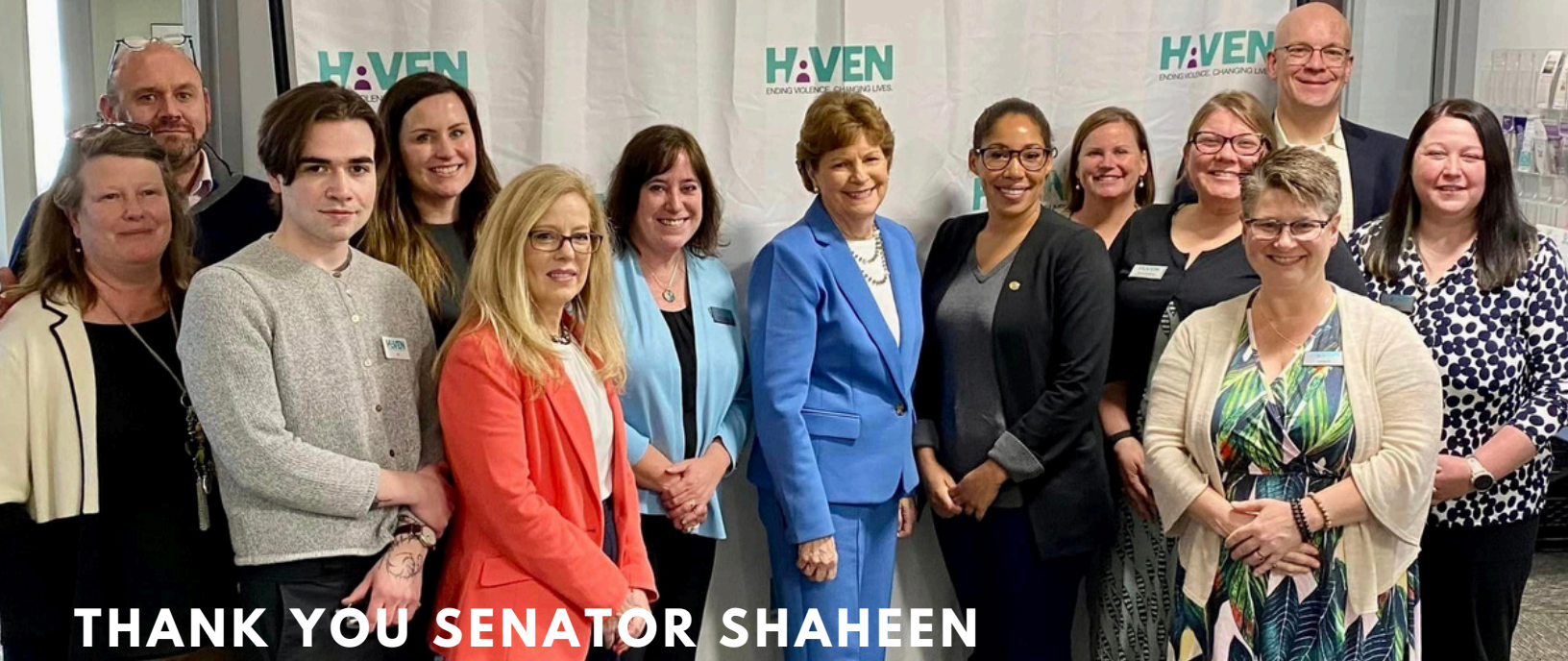
KIDS ARE OUR BUSINESS BREAKFAST 2023
